



Carmel Rain on Main 2020 – Artist Info

Rain on Main is back! Local artists are again invited to paint a rain barrel for this unique program. The painted barrels will be on display **along Main Street in the Carmel Arts & Design District** the week of August 7th-15th including the August Gallery Walk. On

Saturday August 15th the barrels will be displayed at the **Carmel Farmer's Market** and a silent auction with proceeds benefiting the **Carmel Clay Parks** water information signage will be held.

The barrels will be part of an art show (1st, 2nd and 3rd places will receive cash prizes). A "People's Choice" selection, based on votes on Facebook will also be named and 1st and 2nd places will receive a cash prize. Additionally, your barrel and a bio will be featured online in the weeks leading up to the event as well as in social media.

To participate as an artist:

Visit RainonMain.com and submit an application to be an artist on the artist registration page.

Be sure to review the rain barrel painting instructions and timeline to be sure you are able to comply.

After review of your application, approved artists will receive an email from Claire Lane authorizing them to pick up a primed barrel for painting. ***You will be required to show a copy of the email to pick up your barrel.***

After approval, pick up your barrel from Carmel Utilities Water Operations Office

Rain Barrel Instructions

- Barrels have been sanded and primed by Touch and Go Collision of Carmel.
- The barrel can be painted with any acrylic paint.
- Artwork does not need to have an environmental theme. However, avoid designs of a political, religious or sexual nature. Do not use any copyrighted content or any logos. We have also noticed that designs that feature faces (human or mystical) and words (aside from very common short phrases - Island Time theme) typically do not perform well in the auction. You are welcome to sign your barrel.
- The paint on the rain barrels takes much longer to dry than typical artist mediums. Avoid heavy layering of paint and thick areas, it results in the paint peeling up. **Allow for extended drying time.**
- When your barrel is **fully dried (at least 48 hours)**, **apply at least two coats of protectant (provided).** **Be sure to let the barrel fully dry between coats (24 hours).**
- **Barrel painting should be complete no later than June 20th to allow a week for drying and protectant coat applications (with full dry between).**
- Once your barrel is painted, coated, and DRY, return your barrel, **in the original box**, to the pick-up location anytime Monday through Friday 8 - 4:30 pm.

Completed barrels are due back to Carmel Water Operations Office by June 26th.
